Tuesday 30th– Future prep students will attend half a day at school with P-2 class until lunch (1:25)



Tuesday 7th– Future prep students will attend a whole day at school as part of the State Wide transition day.

In reading, the children have been completing assessments and experimenting with different reading materials. They tried out our online version of PM books and they were a hit! They have also been revising single and complex sounds.



In writing, the children have been finishing off their Sounds Write unit involving CCVCC words. They have used this time to finish off any incomplete work too.

In Maths, the concepts of positional language and following directions have been introduced. They had to put their listening ears on to follow directions about where they should position their bodies with the chair. e.g. put your left leg under the chair. They will start to follow more complex directions today.

The students have continued testing this week and it has been wonderful to see students making progress with their studies. In between tests students have been practising for the showcase and preparing their stop motion animations which are looking great. Students will continue to plan and create their narrative on a scary story and today will be digging up their buried waste to see what has decomposed or not as part of our science unit. Santa has come early and left some lessons for us, so students have been exposed to some Christmas reading, maths, grammar, and word work lessons building up to December. Students are still breaking into their spelling groups and in maths have been revising previously learnt topics and learning to problem solve by drawing a table.
